DATA ENTRY OPERATORS put data into the computer. You need to finish high school. You can be trained for this job in a short time. You need good typing skills.





You need to finish high school. Some high schools give some training. You will need training in electronics at a technical or community college. **PROGRAMMERS** write programs. Programs are the instructions in one of the computer languages that let the computer do its work. You will need a college degree in computer science.
